Bullet Points from the Board meeting

Ministry of Health's request for Expressions of Interest for the delivery of Better Sooner, More Convenient Primary Health Care

- the RCPHO and HKPHO submission "The Rural Canterbury Voice" was not successful. The Canterbury Clinical Network were one of the nine submissions approved and they have commenced the development of a business case for the Ministry of Health.

The Ministry of Health to be advised that the Rural Canterbury and Hurunui Kaikoura PHO's EOI can be published on their website.

Dr Mick Tarry has been re-nominated as the provider representative on the RCPHO for Ashburton TLA, for a term of three years.

The Chair of HKPHO will be resigning at their AGM on Wednesday, 2 December, so this was his last meeting with the RCPHO Board. The new Chair of HKPHO would be invited to attend RCPHO Board meetings as a co-opted member.

The Board agreed that several proposals approved over the recent year which had not been funded by the CDHB or from other sources be funded for 12 months from the RCPHO's surplus funds:

- ◆ Marae based clinics
- ◆ Additional Mental Health extended consultations
- ◆ Cervical Screens for 'Hard to Reach' allocated to Waimakariri practices
- ◆ Youth BIC worker for Ashburton
- ◆ Diabetes Nurse Manager
- ◆ 8 courses— Appetite for Life
- ◆ Baby Feeding Support Service - additional hours for rural service

RCPHO to continue to fund 8 hours per week for Child Health from 1 January to 30 June 2010.

- Ashburton Youth Health Centre client contacts to be monitored and assessed as part of a review of the service provision from this centre.
